Every day a fleet of around 300 bottom trawlers in international waters destroy an area of the deep-sea floor equivalent to 148 rugby fields every minute. Dragging enormous weighted nets through thousands of kilometers of vulnerable deep-sea habitat they destroy everything in their path in a search for an ever decreasing supply of orange roughy. Along with ten other nations, New Zealand is amongst the worst culprits.

The destruction can be stopped and you can help
NZ has played an important role on the world stage against whaling and in keeping the Pacific nuclear free. We now have the chance to play an important role again

A united nations moratorium would stop bottom trawling in international waters until effective protection for deep sea life can be put in place. Dozens of countries have already expressed support for the UN moratorium and now NZ needs to work with them to bring other countries on board.

The issue will be decided in September 2006 so now is the time for you to put pressure on the politicians.
